Course Overview

All McKinney ISD Latin language classes will enable students to communicate in a foreign language. To achieve this overarching premise, all learning occurs based on the World- Readiness Standards for Learning Languages as defined by the national American Council on the Teaching of Foreign Languages (ACTFL) and the TEKS for LOTE. Classes are designed around seven themes: Literary Genre and Style, Roman Values, War and Empire, Leadership, Views of Non-Romans, History and Memory and Human Beings and the Gods. Based on these themes, language units are designed to communicate about and raise awareness for cultural products, practices and perspectives. Each unit has structural foundations to enable students to practice their language skills in all modes of communication through contextualized activities and the integration of a variety of authentic contexts based on interdisciplinary topics.
