MISD already uses Choosing the Best program at the HS level. SHAC is reviewing The 180 Degree Program for use in conjunction with the current curriculum.

There are parent curriculum seminars. Here, they tell parents what their child is going to learn. Give tips and information on how to talk with their children about sex and related topics.

Meets TEKS requirements

Provides local community resources

Program can be done in an assembly setting or most effectively in the classroom setting which is a more personal setting.

Learn about the emotional aspects of being in a sexual relationship with a person that they are not fully committed to.

Teach about boundaries, limits and telling kids what not to do. This is a program about choices, accountability and goals.

This is based out of a Free Clinic in Plano. At the clinic they offer free STD testing, pregnancy testing and ultrasounds, counseling and other services. It is funded by Faith Based organizations. The program is not going to discriminate against any religion, and not going to teach religion or preach to children or parents.

Karin stated she has spoken to other districts that use this program and have had good feedback.

Rebeka Ecker stated that she had 180 degree program come to speak to her classes many years ago and was very well received. Also, good to teach girls that already have a child that abstinence is still OK going forward.

In HS, parents do not need to provide approval. It is in the TEKS and difficult to not give all students the same education.

Karin asked for a vote to pilot the program at Boyd HS, Patricia Aranibar made a motion to accept and Verlinda Turley seconded the motion.
