Boyd students compete in district 9-6A UIL interscholastic academics, fine arts and athletics including: several student competitive academic organizations, six fine arts programs and 20 girls and boys sports. The Boyd Broncos have claimed several district and regional titles in all areas as well as several State Championships in girls soccer, wrestling and track. McKinney Boyd High School has received a letter grade of an "A" from the Texas Education Agency.

**Semester Credit** – A student earns credit for a semester course with a minimum of 70.

**Full Year Course** – A student earns credit for a full year course with a minimum of 70 as the average of the two semester grades.

All semester courses are included in class rank with the following exceptions: correspondence courses, credit by exam grades, courses for high school credit in 7th and 8th grade, APEX, distance learning, off campus PE and local credit courses.
