Meeting opened by Julie Blankenship at 6:39pm.

Introductions of SHAC committee members. Members reminded that SHAC meetings are being recorded to meet state requirements and will be posted on MISD Website.

Minutes from February 16, 2022, meeting were reviewed and a motion made by Joy Anderson to approve as written and Paul Shirar seconded the motion. All in favor of approval.

Action Items for meeting:

School Board has approved the Goodheart-Wilcox-Health Textbook voted on in the last SHAC meeting.

Phillip Hassler read the school board proclamation that gives the SHAC committee permission to start looking into items listed in Texas Senate Bill 9 and House Bill 1525 which deals with topics relating to human sexuality, sex trafficking prevention, child abuse prevention, dating violence prevention and family violence prevention. Proclamation was read and approved at the last school board meeting.

Application printed and available for 2022/2023 school year for SHAC committee members to reapply. SHAC committee will be on the August school board meeting.

Middle School Human Sexuality-Speaker Rick Shelton introduced the 180 Degrees program.

Rick Shelton has been an abstinence educator since 2009 and the Education Director leading the 180 Degrees program since 2011. The 180 Degrees Program is currently being used in the McKinney ISD High Schools. Mr. Shelton introduced the 180 Degrees Middle School program to the committee. The program is a sexual risk avoidance program, also known as abstinence until marriage program. This program is geared toward middle school students covering topics on building healthy relationships, dating, friendships, building boundaries, and consequences of premarital sex and why abstinence is the BEST choice.

Questions and answer session with Rick Shelton and committee members.

During the 87th Texas Legislation, a new bill ([Texas House Bill 1525](#)) was adopted that requires parents or legal guardians to opt-in their students to participate in the Human Sexuality curriculum.

Two opening meets between now and July 1, pertaining to the curriculum with possible Zoom meeting following Texas Open Records. Discussion of using June 9<sup>th</sup> as meeting date with two meeting times.
