Accredited by the Texas Education Agency and the Southern Association for Colleges and Schools, McKinney High School is the original of 3 public high schools in McKinney. A school board with formalized high school requirements was established in 1883, and in 1889 McKinney High School proudly oversaw the commencement of its first graduating class

of four students. Today McKinney High School serves a diverse population of 2918 students and will graduate 670 students in May 2023.
