### FIRST Rating Indicator 17

The overall score of 100 is reduced to 79 which results in a rating C = Meets Standard Achievement.




### System Overview

Districts and campuses will receive a rating of A, B, C, D, or F for overall performance and for performance in each domain.

- Domain 1: Student Achievement evaluates performance across all subjects on general and alternative assessments.
- Domain 2: School Progress measures district and campus outcomes in two parts (academic growth and relative performance).
- Domain 3: Closing the Gaps uses disaggregated data to demonstrate achievement differentials among racial/ethnic groups, socioeconomic backgrounds, and other factors.



#### What's New in Performance Reporting

#### A-F Accountability

Tuesday, September 12, 2023, the agency released a <u>To The Administrator Addressed</u> <u>Correspondence</u> to inform local educational agencies (LEAs) about a delay in the issuance of the final rule for the accountability manual and a delay in the issuance of 2023 A–F*Accountability Ratings*. The agency will conduct analyses of 2022-2023 statewide growth data and the growth data for the 2018–19 and 2021–22 school years used to inform cut scores in Domain 2a-Academic Growth, and Domain 3-Closing the Gaps.




We currently offer over 30 AP courses

The state offers the following measures that students may use to demonstrate that they are ready for post-secondary success:

- Texas Success Initiative Criteria
  - Must meet for BOTH English & Math
  - Options are SAT, ACT, TSIA, or Texas College Bridge
- AP Scores (3 or better) in any subject
- Dual Credit
  - 3 hours in English OR Math
  - 9 hours in any combination of subjects
- Sequence of CTE Pathway Courses culminating in an Industry Based Certification (from a state approved list)
- Military Enlistment
- Advanced Achievement from Students Served by Special Education

### Implementation of Texas College Bridge

Offered for juniors and seniors through academic level English and Math courses this year

#### Benefits of Texas College Bridge:

- TCB is a free, online college preparatory resource. The instruction covers English and Math skills that students will need to demonstrate college readiness
- Instruction is customized for the student's individual strengths and opportunities
- Content can be accessed outside of school hours
- Once the course is completed, students will receive a certificate of completion and can earn a Texas Success Initiative (TSI) exemption at more than <u>70</u> partnering colleges and universities across Texas

# Expanded Access to TSI Testing for Certain Juniors & Seniors

The Texas Success Initiative (TSI) was created by statute in cooperation with TEA and THECB. The purpose of the program is to ensure that students are achieving academic readiness for success in college level courses. Students may demonstrate readiness through a variety of measures including SAT and ACT scores

This fall, we will continue to offer PSAT to every 10th grader and any 11th graders who wish to participate in NMSQT. We also will continue to offer SAT during the school day this spring

NEW this October, we will be offering the Accuplacer (a TSI measure used by Collin College and many other colleges & universities) to students who may need another chance to demonstrate their academic readiness for postsecondary success

Students who are successful on Accuplacer will meet TSI criteria for up to <u>5 years</u> after graduation
