The attached report for the quarter ended March 31, 2024, reflects investment balances and transactions broken out by both fund and investment type.

The market value of the overall portfolio increased by \$10.4 million during the quarter, and now totals \$322.3 million.

The average portfolio yield on March 31 was 5.308% compared to 5.352% on December 31.

Investment income earned during the quarter totaled \$4,700,279.

## Market Recap

The extreme bond market volatility continued in March as investors tried to determine exactly when the Fed would begin cutting the overnight target rate. Economic growth and labor market conditions proved much more resilient than expected while inflation measures failed to cool enough to quell market concerns. The result was higher yields during the month and the expectation that rate policy would remain higher for longer.

The first market-moving release in March actually nudged yields *lower*. The February ISM Services index slipped from 53.4 to 52.6, suggesting the service sector might be taking a breather. The following day, the February employment report appeared mixed as nonfarm payrolls increased by a solid +275k while the previous two months were revised lower by -167k. The separate household survey told a wildly contrasting story as the number of employed workers fell -184k, after dropping by a combined -151k in the previous two months. The headline unemployment rate increased from 3.7% to 3.9%, the highest since January 2022, as +150k workers entered (or reentered) the civilian labor force in February.

Consumer inflation was once again warmer-than-expected. Headline consumer price index (CPI) climbed +0.4% in February, which boosted the year-over-year pace up from +3.1% to +3.2%. Shelter costs and gasoline combined to account for over 60% of the monthly gain. The annual CPI core rate (which excludes food and energy) slipped from +3.9% to +3.8% but missed the more hopeful +3.7% median forecast.

Producer prices followed the same uncomfortably warm path with headline PPI jumping +0.6%, double both the January increase and the February median forecast. On a year-over-year basis, overall PPI rose at a mostly benign +1.6% pace, up from +1.0% in January, while core PPI held steady at +2.0%. Although producer prices were more in line with the Fed's target, the shift upward was a concern.

Retail sales were generally expected to rebound after bad weather contributed to a January sales slump, but that bounce-back wasn't nearly as strong as analysts expected with February retail sales climbing by +0.6%, a bit weaker than the +0.8% forecast. On top of that, the previously reported decline in January sales was revised lower from -0.8% to -1.1%,

while the December sales increase was revised downward from +0.4% to +0.1%. "Control group" sales were unchanged in February after falling a revised -0.3% in January. Because the control group is used to calculate GDP, it suggested slower Q1 GDP growth.

With a huge batch of fresh economic data to consider, Fed officials met in mid-March and voted unanimously to leave the overnight funds rate unchanged for the fifth consecutive meeting. The Fed's updated "dot plot" continued to show a total of 75 basis points in rate cuts this year, leaving the median funds forecast for the end of 2024 at 4.6%. The 2025 projection showed one fewer cut, moving the yearend funds forecast up from 3.6% to 3.9% and the 2026 forecast from 2.9% to 3.1%, although Powell noted that the dot plot is fluid and not a plan.

The committee's GDP forecast for 2024 increased from +1.4% at the December meeting to +2.1%, while the 2025 forecast was revised upward from +1.8% to +2.0% and the 2026 forecast from +1.9% to +2.0%. In the Fed's mind, the likelihood of recession continues to fade. The committee acknowledged recent higher-than-expected price pressures by revising 2024 yearend core PCE higher from +2.4% to +2.6%, although the 2025 and 2026 core inflation forecasts were unchanged at +2.2% and +2.0% respectively.

Both Q1 GDP forecasts and the early data suggest growth has slowed quarter to quarter. Just how quickly this softening of demand translates into lower prices will dictate the timing and magnitude of rate cuts later this year.

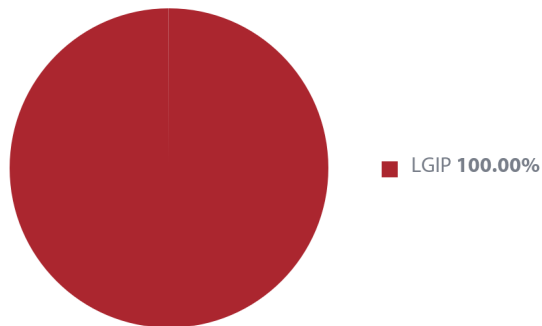

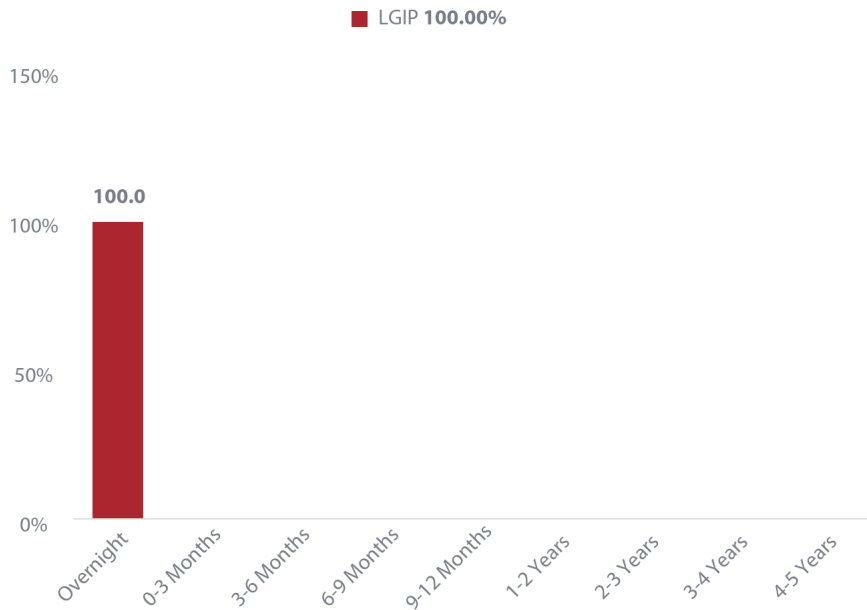

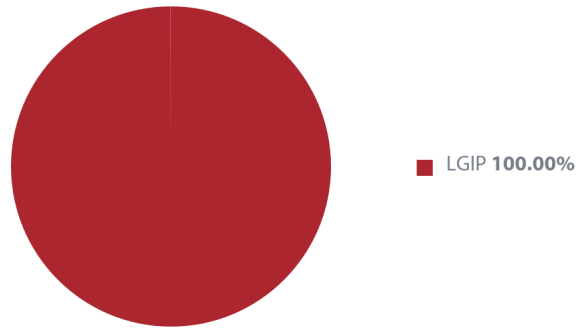

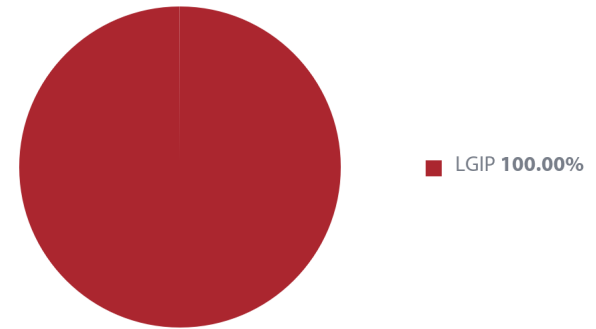

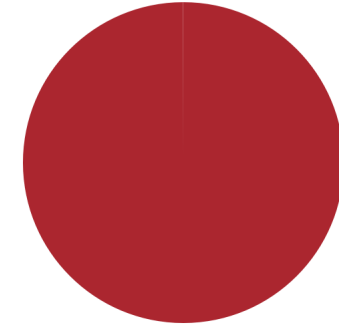

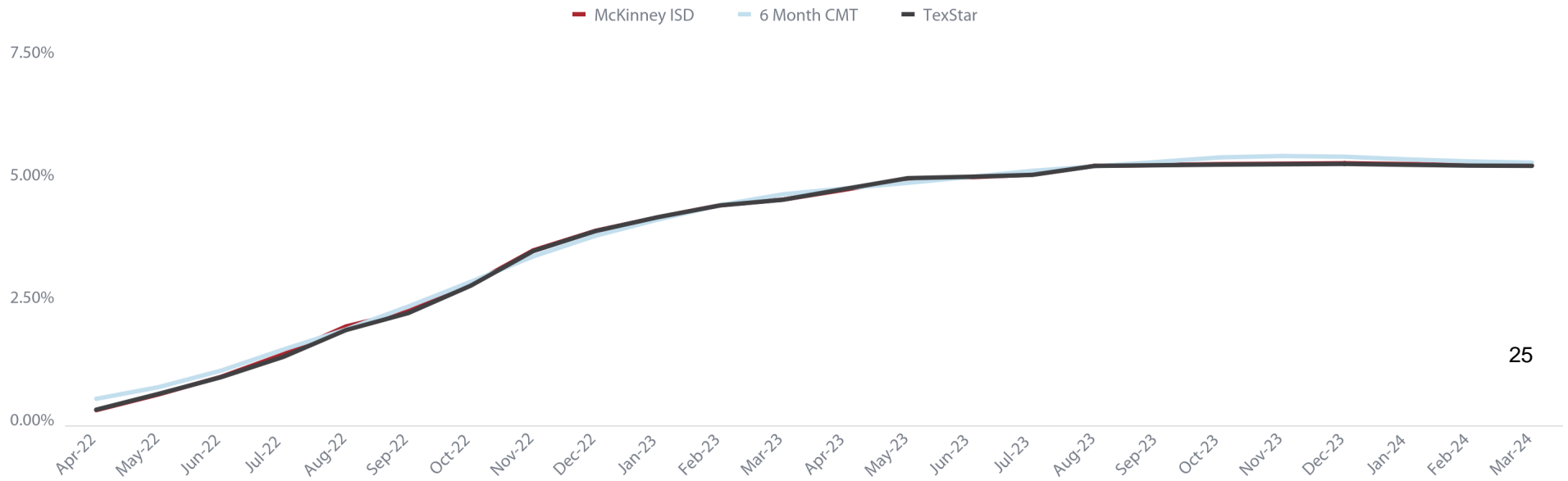
### Allocation by Rating

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The Texas Education Code allows school districts to submit certain waivers for approval on an annual or biannual basis. As we have in the past, we would like to submit the following waivers to align with current district practices.

1) Staff Development Minutes Waiver (24-25 School Year)

Pursuant to Texas Education Code (TEC) §25.081 this waiver allows the district or charter school to train staff on various educational strategies designed to improve student performance in lieu of a maximum of:

- 2,100 minutes of student instruction for districts and charter schools that provide operational and instructional minutes; or
- 5 days of student instruction for charter schools that provide 180 days of operation

2) Modified Schedule State Assessment Testing Days (24-25 School Year)

This waiver allows the district or charter school to modify the schedule of classes for students who are not being tested to report to and attend school after the state assessment testing period has ended, therefore reducing the interruptions during testing period. Students who are not being tested must still meet the four-hour requirement for funding (see SAAH 3.6.6 Attendance Accounting during Testing Days).

3) Limit to the Number of Foreign Exchange Students (24-25 School Year & 25-26 School Year)

Pursuant to TEC §25.001(e) this expedited waiver allows the district to limit the number of foreign exchange students to a number that is not less than five per high school. An application to limit the number to less than five per high school must be submitted as a general waiver. We request a limit of five students per high school. Our reason is accepting an unlimited number could create a financial or staffing hardship for the district.

**Impact Statement:** Approval of these three waivers will align to existing practices and the adopted instructional calendar.

### PROPOSED REVISIONS 3.11.24

No employee shall give any student prescription medication, non-prescription medication, herbal substances, anabolic steroids, or dietary supplements of any type, except as authorized by this or other District policy.

#### **Medication Provided by Parent**

The Superintendent shall designate the employees who are authorized to administer medication that has been provided by a student's parent. An authorized employee is permitted to administer the following medication in accordance with administrative regulations:

1. Prescription medication in accordance with legal requirements.
2. Nonprescription medication, upon a parent's written request, when properly labeled and in the original container.
3. Herbal substances or dietary supplements provided by the parent and only if required by the individualized education program or Section 504 plan for a student with disabilities.

#### **Medication Provided by District**

Except required by law and as provided by this policy, the District shall not purchase medication to administer to a student.

##### *Epinephrine*

The District authorizes school personnel who have agreed in writing and been adequately trained to administer an unassigned epinephrine auto-injector in accordance with law and this policy. Administration of epinephrine shall only be permitted when an authorized and trained individual reasonably believes a person is experiencing anaphylaxis.

##### *On Campus*

Authorized and trained individuals may administer an unassigned epinephrine auto-injector at any time to a person experiencing anaphylaxis on a school campus.

The District shall ensure that at each campus a sufficient number of authorized individuals are trained to administer epinephrine so that at least one trained individual is present on campus during all hours the campus is open. In accordance with state rules, the campus shall be considered open for this purpose during regular on-campus school hours and whenever school personnel are physically on site for school-sponsored activities.

##### *Maintenance, Availability, and Training*

The Superintendent shall develop administrative regulations designating a coordinator to manage policy implementation and addressing annual training of authorized individuals in accordance

<b>Threat Assessment and Safe and Supportive Team</b>	In compliance with law, the Superintendent shall ensure that a multidisciplinary threat assessment and safe and supportive team is established to serve each campus. The Superintendent shall appoint team members. The team shall be responsible for developing and implementing a safe and supportive school program at each campus served by the team and shall support the District in implementing its multi-hazard emergency operations plan.
Training	Each team shall complete training provided by an approved provider on evidence-based threat assessment programs.
Student Reports	Each campus shall establish a clear procedure for a student to report concerning behavior exhibited by another student for assessment by the team or other appropriate District employee.
Employee Confidentiality	<p>A District employee who reports a potential threat may elect for the employee's identity to remain confidential and not be subject to disclosure under the state's public information law. The employee's identity shall only be revealed when necessary for the team, the District, or law enforcement to investigate the reported threat.</p> <p>The District shall maintain a record of the identity of a District employee who elects for the employee's identity to remain confidential.</p>
Imminent Threats or Emergencies	A member of the team or any District employee may act immediately to prevent an imminent threat or respond to an emergency, including contacting law enforcement directly.
Threat Assessment Process	<p>The District shall develop procedures as recommended by the Texas School Safety Center. In accordance with those procedures, the threat assessment and safe and supportive team shall conduct threat assessments using a process that includes:</p> <ol style="list-style-type: none"><li>1. Identifying individuals, based on referrals, tips, or observations, whose behavior has raised concerns due to threats of violence or exhibition of behavior that is harmful, threatening, or violent. This team shall ensure students are informed of how to report concerning behavior by another student.</li><li>2. Conducting an individualized assessment based on reasonably available information to consider whether the individual poses a threat of violence or poses a risk of harm to self or others and the level of risk.</li><li>3. Implementing appropriate intervention and monitoring strategies, if the team detects the potential for an individual to pose</li></ol>

a threat of harm to self or others. These strategies may include advising the family to seek a mental health assessment for the student or escalating the concern to the appropriate emergency services.

~~4. In accordance with law and FFAC(LOCAL) and the multihazard emergency operation plan, if an emergency safety concern is present, a student may be excluded from school or a school related activity pending the certificate of the attending medical provider which attests that the child does not currently have signs or symptoms of an imminent medical concern and may safely reenter school.~~

If the team detects that an individual has the potential to pose a serious risk of violence to self or others, the team shall immediately report to the Superintendent, who shall immediately attempt to contact the student's parent or guardian. Additionally, the Superintendent shall coordinate with law enforcement authorities as necessary and take other appropriate action in accordance with the District's multihazard emergency operations plan.

For a student the team identifies as at risk of suicide, the team shall follow the District's suicide prevention procedures, including planning for the student's safety when the student returns to campus.

For a student the team identifies as having a substance abuse issue, the team shall follow the District's substance abuse response protocols.

For a student whose conduct may constitute a violation of the District's Student Code of Conduct, the team shall make a referral to the campus behavior coordinator or other appropriate administrator to consider disciplinary action.

As appropriate, the team may provide information to the parent about:

1. A local mental health authority or health-care provider for evaluation or treatment; or
2. For a full individualized and initial evaluation for special education services.

The team shall not provide any mental health-care services, except as permitted by law.

Guidance to School  
Community

The team shall provide guidance to students and District employees on recognizing harmful, threatening, or violent behavior that

may pose a threat to another person, the campus, or the community and methods to report such behavior to the team, including through anonymous reporting.

Reports

The team shall provide reports to the Texas Education Agency as required by law.

The remaining work requires some interior adjustments needed to add four new restrooms and a classroom in the west wing at Malvern Elementary School. See the attached Building Plan Drawing and Partial Floor Plan of the F-wing for reference. The restroom additions are required to meet the Daycare Program requirements set forth by the State of Texas Department of Health and Human Services. The State of Texas requires that the facility have one restroom per 17 children. Four restrooms would allow for a maximum of 68 children. 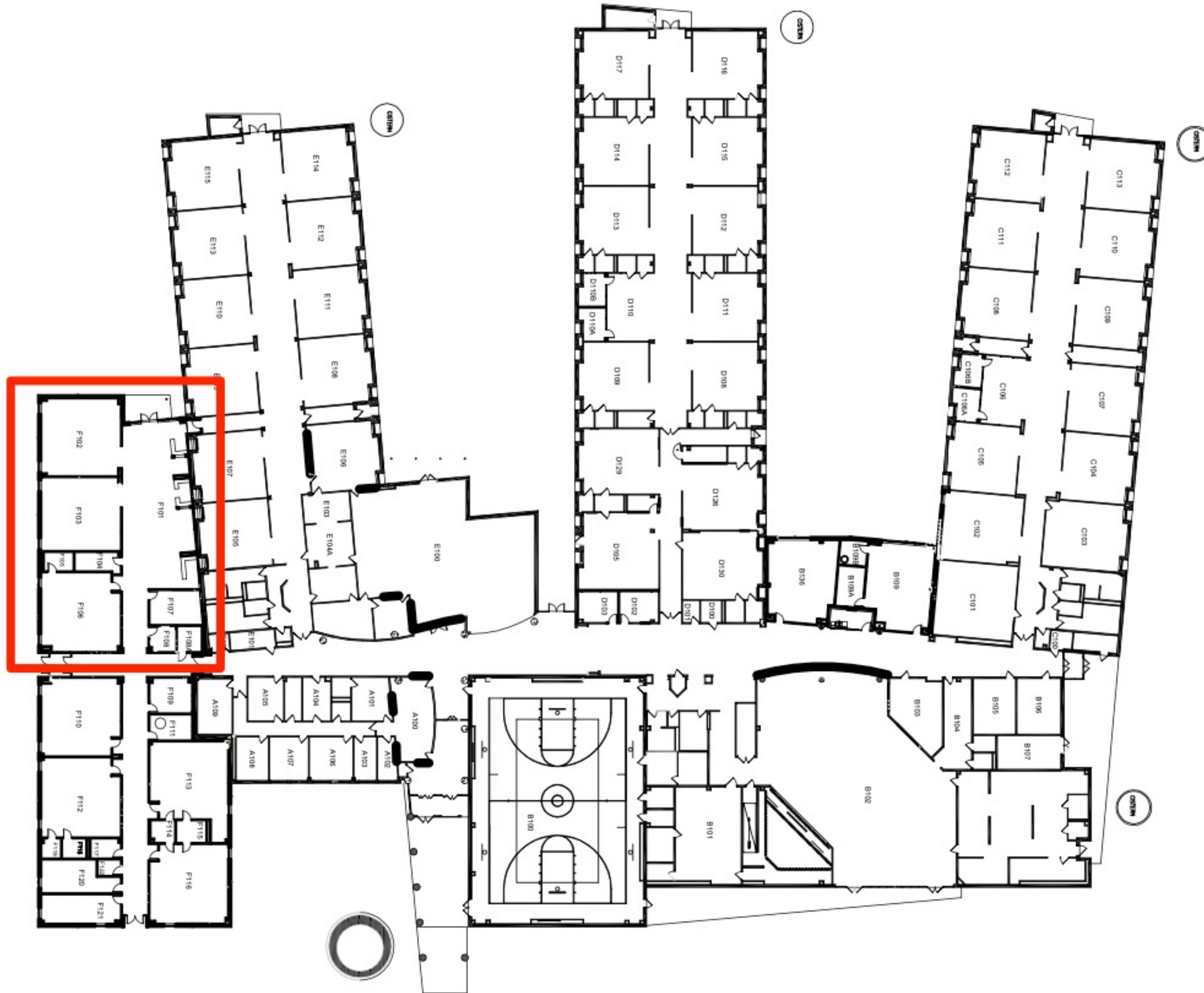

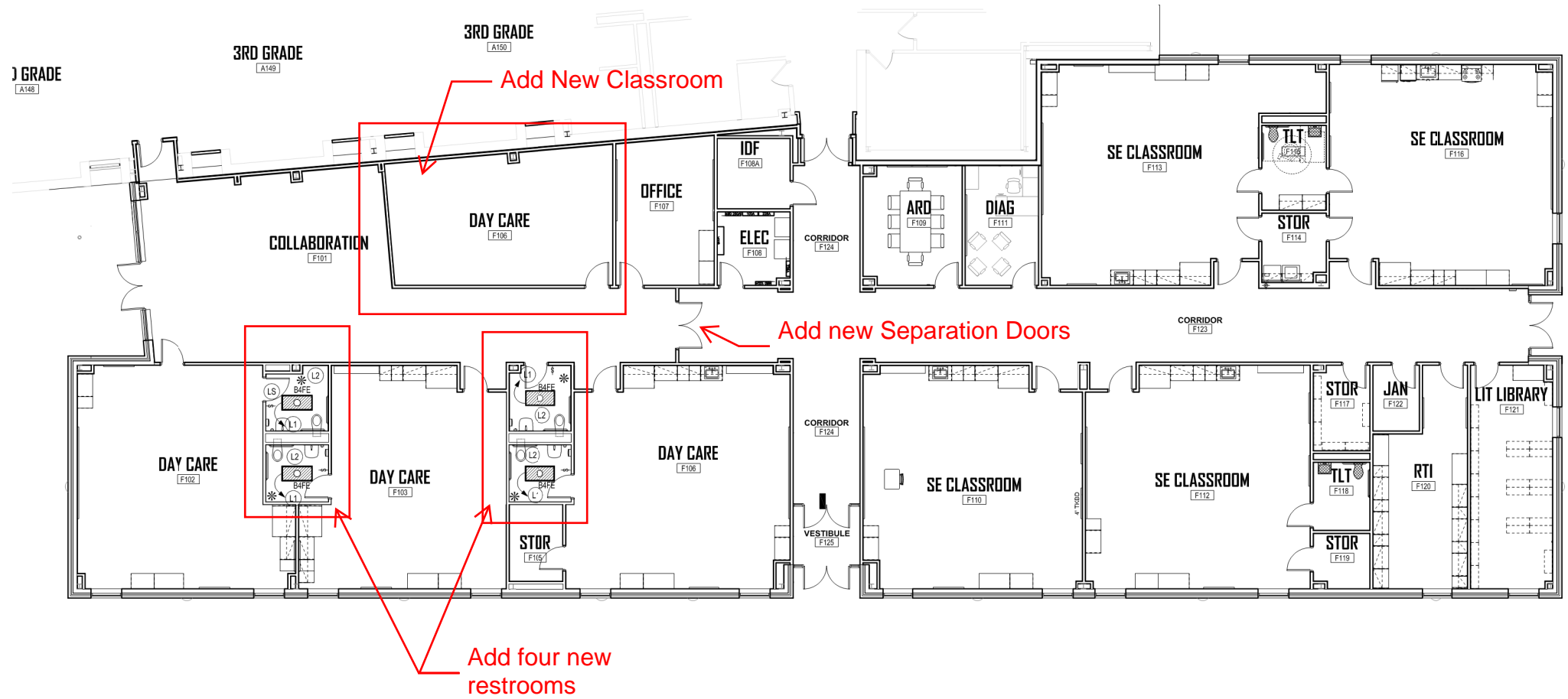

The 2021 Bond Election included \$2,000,000 for playground upgrades. Recently, the district had We Build Fun perform a playground equipment and fall zone area review at all our elementary school campuses. As part of this review, the district received proposals for upgrading some of our equipment as well as upgrading some of our fall zone areas to a poured in place surface system that provides a little firmer travel surface for our more accessibility challenged students. Although the playgrounds currently meet ADA requirements, the upgrades will help make the playgrounds more user-friendly and inclusive for all students. The district proposes to complete half of the playground upgrades during the summer of 2024 and the remaining half during the summer of 2025. During the review process, we reached out to the schools and our special populations department to help prioritize which schools should be completed during the summer of 2024.

The following ten elementary schools will be upgraded the summer of 2024: Bennett, Eddins, Malvern, McClure, McGowen, McNeil, Press, Slaughter, Webb, and Wolford. The cost of the upgrades to these schools is a total of \$1,626,993. In addition to these 10 schools, the playground areas at Finch ES will be upgraded as part of the summer 2024 refresh project. Refer to the attached Summary of Proposals that were submitted by We Build Fun, via the BuyBoard cooperative purchasing contract 679-22. We have also attached the proposals for each individual school. The work will begin June 1, 2024, and be completed prior to the start of school.

- Submission of the Certification 2024–25 Survey and upload of the ratified Certification 2024–25 Form.

TEA recommends that LEAs complete these steps by **May 1, 2024**. The Certification 2024–25 Form can be accessed at the following link on the [Instructional Materials webpage](#).

The state online instructional materials ordering system, EMAT, will close for annual maintenance on March 29, 2024, and is scheduled to reopen on May 15, 2024. **Completion of the Certification Process is required to regain access to allotment funds when EMAT reopens in May of 2024.**

Certification 2024–25 Survey submissions received after May 15, 2024, will typically be processed within five business days, then access to EMAT provided.

The McKinney ISD Safety & Security Department, in conjunction with the Technology Department, has explored numerous solutions to increase the physical safety and security on MISD campuses. We are recommending Verkada as the integrated physical security platform to replace security cameras, door access control, video intercoms, and environmental sensors across campuses. Phase 1 of this project will include McKinney Boyd, McKinney High, McKinney North, and the MISD Stadium & Community Event Center. The remaining campuses will be included in future bond planning.

The physical security upgrade project includes the Verkada hardware, 10-year licensing, 10-year warranty & support, and installation. Additional network switches and network cabling are needed to accommodate the increase in the number of devices being added to the network.

In accordance with McKinney ISD Board Policy CH(LEGAL), District administration recommends utilizing the purchasing contracts detailed below. As a reminder, purchasing cooperatives take the responsibility to legally bid, document, and manage the awarded contracts for its governmental members.

### Detect Unexpected Activity

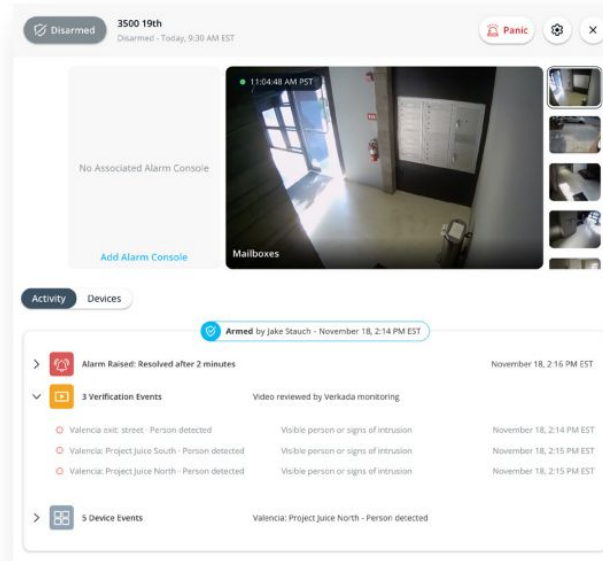

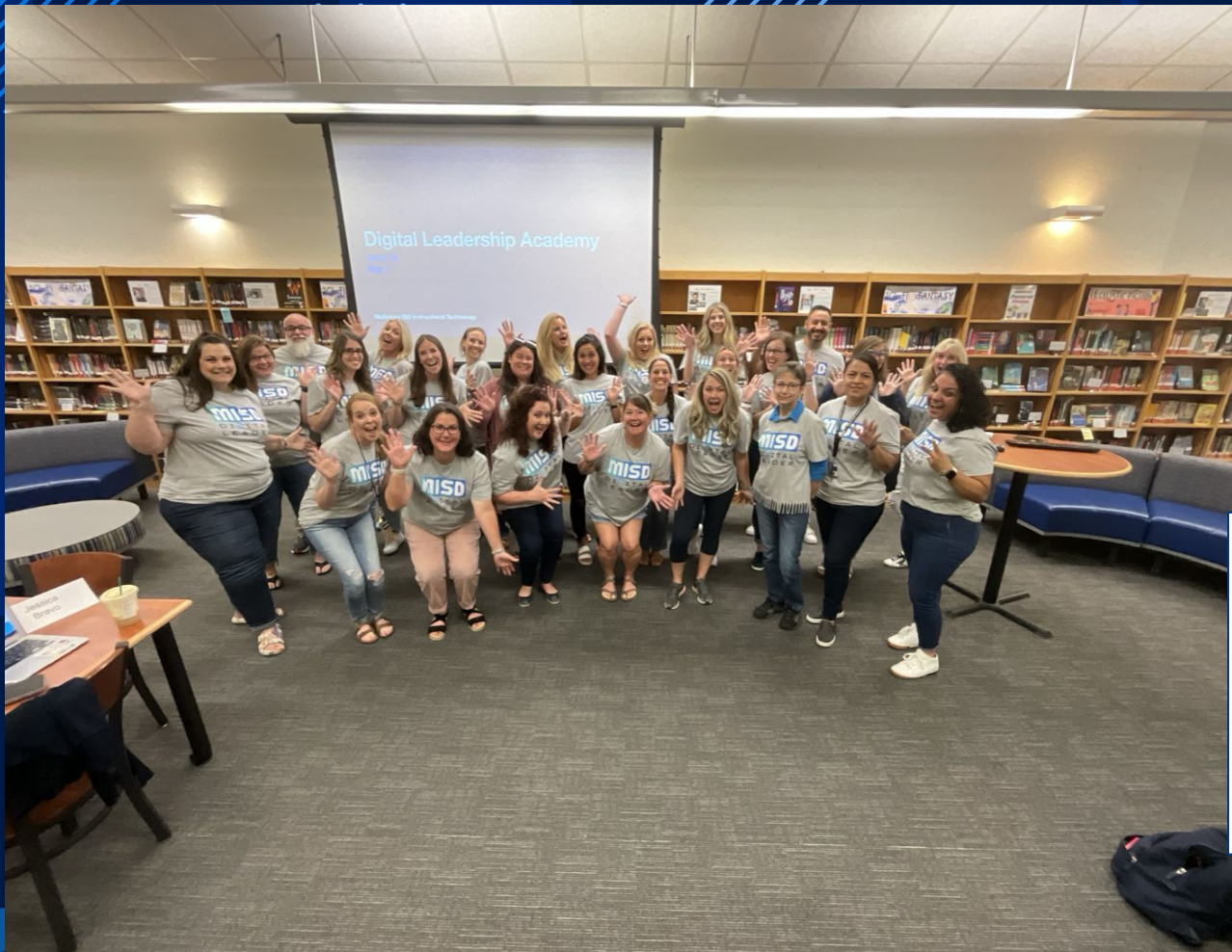

# Special Populations

SCHOOL BOARD REPORT  
2023-2024





*The McKinney ISD Special Populations Department believes that all individuals are born with inherent value and that all individuals need to feel safe and secure in their learning environment. Further, we believe that all individuals deserve an environment that is conducive to mental, physical and spiritual growth. We also believe that education is a shared responsibility and that personal relationships, especially with parents and adult students are vital to learning.*



# Special Populations Enrollment Data

6,987 students served through either 504 services or Special Education.

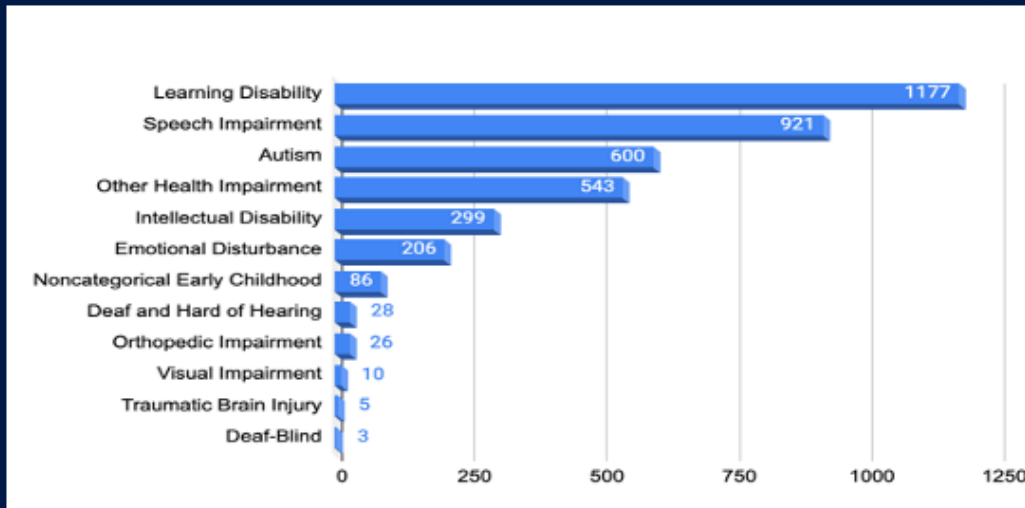

In our school district, the Special Populations Department plays a vital role in ensuring that student's educational needs are met, regardless of their individual challenges or learning differences. In the latest Fall PEIMs Snapshot, a total of 6,987 students have been provided services through either the 504 program or Special Education. Within this cohort, 3,083 students were served by the 504 program, constituting approximately 13.23% of the total student enrollment. Furthermore, the Special Education program has supported the needs of 3,904 students, representing approximately 16.75% of the student body. These figures underscore the importance of our commitment to supporting diverse learning needs within our educational community, ensuring that each student receives the necessary resources and accommodations to thrive academically and personally. Through collaborative efforts and a student-centered approach, we continue to strive towards fostering an inclusive and equitable learning environment where every student can thrive.

# Mckinney Students Served in Special Education



The following graph shows the number of students by primary eligibility category from PEIMS data on October 27, 2023.

The students served within our Special Education program encompass a diverse array of needs, each requiring specialized support and accommodations to facilitate their academic and personal growth. Among the largest categories are those with Learning Disabilities, comprising 1,177 individuals, and Speech Impairments, with 921 students. Autism services support 600 students, while 543 students receive support for Other Health Impairments. Additionally, our program serves students with Intellectual Disabilities (299), Emotional Disturbances (206), and Noncategorical Early Childhood needs (86). Smaller yet equally important categories include those with Deaf and Hard of Hearing (28), Orthopedic Impairments (26), Visual Impairments (10), Traumatic Brain Injuries (5), and Deaf-Blindness (3). Each of these students represents a unique set of challenges and strengths, and our commitment remains steadfast in providing them with the resources and services necessary to thrive within our educational community.



## EXTENDED SCHOOL YEAR (ESY)

### -WHAT IS ESY?

- An individualized instructional program for eligible students with disabilities that is provided beyond the regular school year.
- Designed to help students maintain their educational gains, prevent regression and foster further learning opportunities.
- Built into the student's IEP, as appropriate

One of our important programs in MISD is Extended School Year (ESY) services. These services are for eligible Special Education students that are provided beyond the typical school year. Students must meet eligibility for ESY services, and then the services are programmed as part of their Individualized Education Plan (IEP). ESY services are a required component of the Individuals with Disabilities Education Act (IDEA) to provide a "Free and Appropriate Public Education (FAPE)."

# INDIVIDUALS WITH DISABILITIES EDUCATION ACT

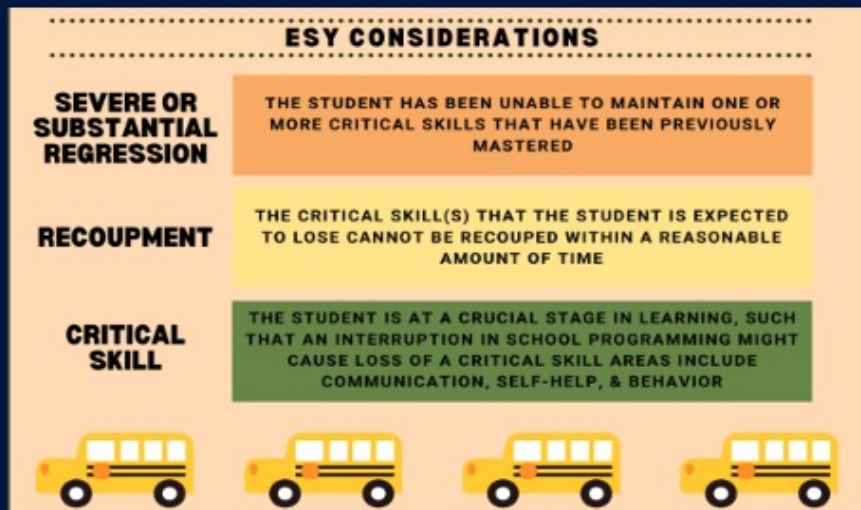


The Individuals with Disabilities Education Act (IDEA) is a landmark law that ensures eligible children with disabilities across the United States have access to a free appropriate public education (FAPE). Enacted to guarantee special education and related services for these children, IDEA sets forth guidelines governing the provision of early intervention, special education, and related services to over 8 million eligible infants, toddlers, children, and youth with disabilities. Emphasizing the fundamental right of individuals with disabilities to participate fully in society, Congress underlines the importance of improving educational outcomes for these individuals as an essential element of national policy.

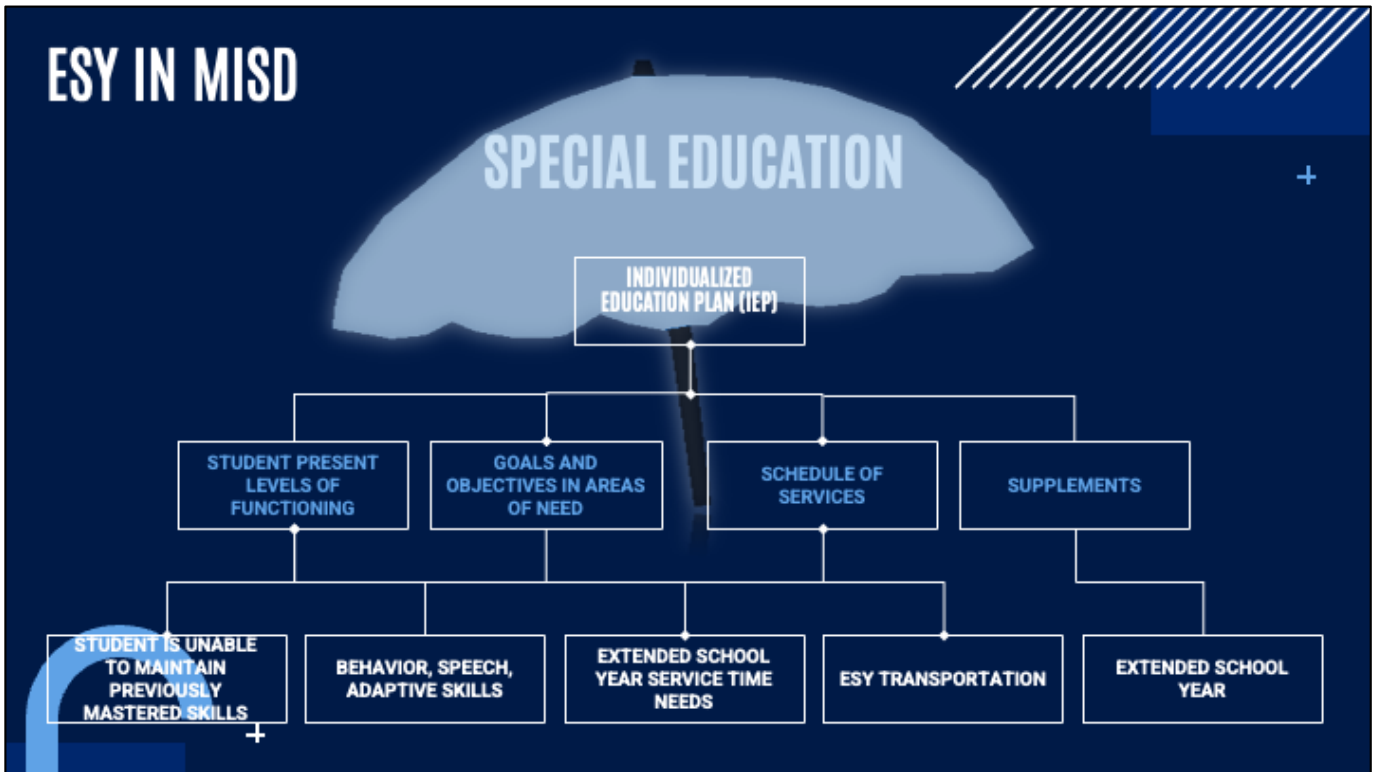

A student meets eligibility requirements to qualify for ESY services through at least one of these criteria:

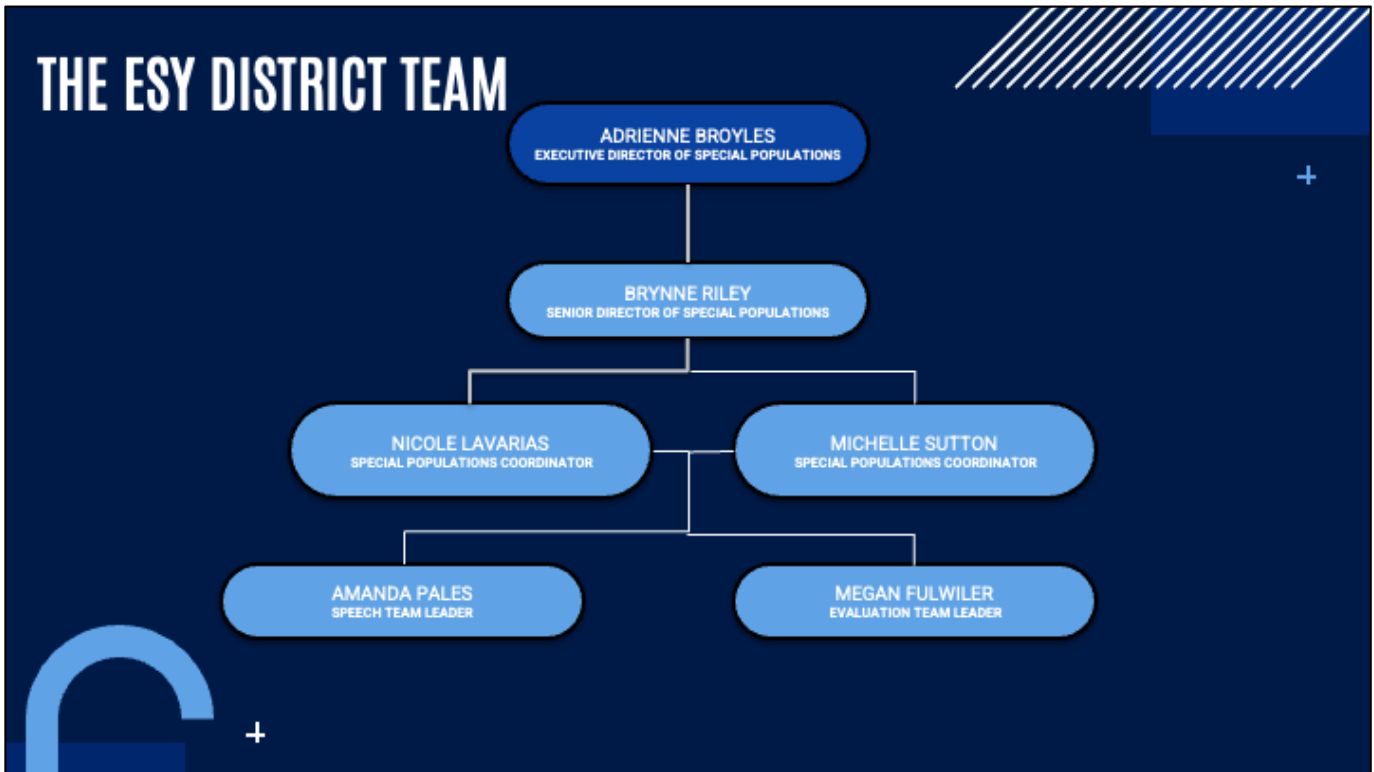
- **Severe or substantial regression:** The student has been unable to maintain one or more critical skill(s) that have been previously mastered.
- **Recoupment:** The critical skill(s) that the student has lost or is expected to lose cannot be recouped within a reasonable amount of time.
- **Critical Skill:** The student is at a crucial stage of learning, such that an interruption in school programming might cause the loss of a critical skill area(s), including communication, behavior, and self-help. For example, a student that has recently acquired a communication device may be eligible for ESY services to continue learning the use of this crucial communication system.



The primary purpose of Special Education is to provide an individualized plan for students to meet their needs and allow them to make progress on goals, so this includes a range of supports and services. All these supports and services must be accounted for in the child's IEP, including the PLAAFP (Present Level of Academic and Functional Performance), goals and objectives, schedule of services and supplements.

The schedule of services accounts for:

- Amount of time in the special education and general education settings
- Inclusion time in the general education setting, including lunch, recess and specials
- Direct and indirect speech therapy
- Direct and indirect related services (such as occupational therapy, physical therapy, and adapted PE)
- Transportation



It takes a team to plan for and execute ESY services. Our team relies on the support that we receive from Adrienne Broyles and Brynne Riley, not only with the day-to-day needs to implement ESY, but also the advocacy that is required to secure the necessary funding and resources for these services.

The Special Education Coordinators and Team Leads work closely together to plan for ESY services, including staffing teachers and paraprofessionals, staffing Speech Pathologists and related service providers, acquiring necessary materials and resources, and coordinating with Durham School Services for bus transportation to and from ESY.

Lots of work and preparation goes into ESY, all throughout the year:

- Beginning of Year - data collection and training begin in August and continues throughout the school year.
- Data Tracking - Data is the driving force. We use data to make decisions, and this includes data from the school year and ESY.
- Collaboration & Decisions - There is extensive collaboration between the District ESY Team, administrators, and teachers throughout the district. We want to ensure that the district staff and families feels supported when making decisions about ESY.
- Preparing for ESY - Many hours go into preparing for ESY, starting with the first day of school. Preparing for ESY includes meetings with the district and individual teachers, budgeting for and ordering supplies, creating class rosters, creating processes/procedures, and coordinating with Durham Transportation Services.
- ESY Begins - This is the best part! We love to see these smiling faces.

# BEGINNING OF THE YEAR

**This is where the preparation begins.**

**Reminders to Special Education teachers to review data**

- Compare end of year data to beginning of year data
- Regression? If so, how long does it take the student to recoup the lost skill?
  
- Offer virtual trainings with teachers to review the district's ESY PowerPoint
  - This information is also shared during monthly Team Lead meetings, starting in September

The beginning of year is when the preparations begin. After summer break, teachers, and staff (including Speech Pathologists and related service providers) begin taking data on student goals. The data from the beginning of the year is then compared to the data collected at the end of the previous school year, allowing for a comparison and a determination if a skill was lost. If the data shows that a student has lost a skill, then the teachers and staff continue to take data to determine how long it will take the student to recoup the skill, as it was a previously mastered skill. This is an important of data for ESY eligibility.

The team also spends a large amount of time at the beginning of the year training teachers (new and returning) on ESY, including how to track goals and take data, filling out the ESY supplement, determining which goals are appropriate, and how to determine the amount of time required for each student.

# DATA TRACKING

Data is taken all year long - starting the first day of school!

Beginning in October, a google form is shared with teachers and staff to begin referring students that have demonstrated regression and recoupment following an extended break (summer).

This google form is shared monthly through January, as it also takes into account regression and recoupment following Thanksgiving break and winter break.

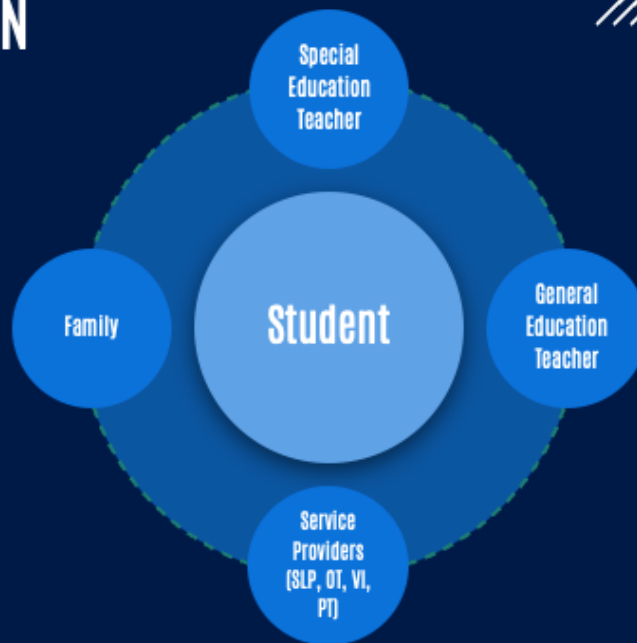
Teachers and staff take data daily on student goals. This information is used to determine not only progress on goals, but also if the student has lost previously mastered skills (regression). Data continues to be collected, as that shows the amount of time required to recoup the lost skill.

Starting in October of each year, a google form is shared with teachers and staff during the monthly Team Lead meetings to begin documenting students that demonstrated regression/recoupment following long breaks, including summer break, Thanksgiving break and winter break.

Once the District ESY team receives this information, they begin meeting with the teachers and staff to review the data. The determination for ESY services is an ARD committee decision. These meetings are ongoing throughout the year and start in the fall.



## COLLABORATION & DECISIONS



The decision for ESY services is an ARD committee decision, including the Special Education and General Education teachers, the student's parents/guardians, and the student's service providers (such as the speech therapist, occupational therapist, Teacher of Visually Impaired (TVI), and physical therapist).

Each member's contribution to the discussion is important and is gathered as part of each student's Annual ARD and to determine each student's present levels. During the ARD, the stakeholders determine which goals will be addressed, the amount of service time, and if transportation is required.

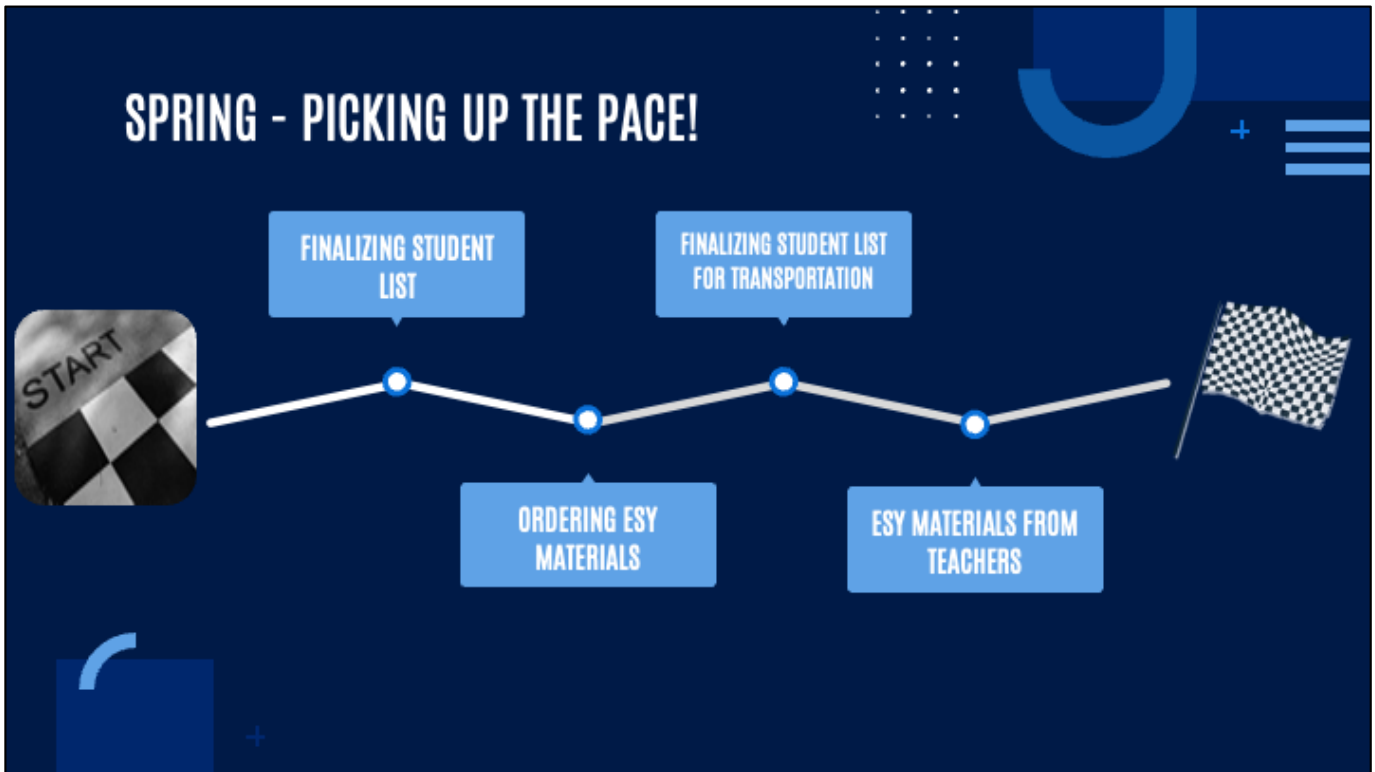
The ESY District team works closely with classroom teachers to make sure they have data and knowledge to make the best service recommendations for students. A resource that is incredibly beneficial to our teachers are the guides for ESY Schedule of Services (SOS) and transportation supplement. At least one member of the team meets with each teacher that is recommending services to discuss data and recommendations.

Amanda Pales, Speech Team Lead, works to secure Speech-Language Pathologists (SLP) to provide speech support for students. For many students, communication is a critical skill that they are working on and often requires support from the SLP, including direct speech therapy, feeding, and swallowing safety and support, communication consult for teachers and staff, as well as consult and troubleshooting for Augmentative and Alternative Communication Systems (AAC). The District ESY team also works to secure related service providers as needed, including Occupational Therapists, and Physical Therapists.

The team meets weekly throughout the school year to ensure that all

processes and procedures are streamlined and current. As we approach the end of the school year, decisions are made regarding ESY materials drop off (in May) and pick up (end of July/early August) as each student's teacher(s) send materials to implement a student's goals. Once all materials have been dropped off, the District ESY Team works together to transport all the materials to the ESY campus.

As the final list for students attending ESY is firmed up by May, the team begins making class rosters and assigning teachers and paraprofessionals to each room. Many classrooms have a small number of students, but this depends on the student and their individual needs. The team strives to create a safe and collaborative learning environment for all students and staff.



Since ESY is an ARD committee decision, it can be added to a student’s plan through the last day of school. While the District ESY team strives to have an accurate list of students that will be attending by the beginning of May, we are also very flexible and skilled at making adjustments. Each student comes with an individualized IEP, which often includes classroom and/or feeding/swallowing accommodations, positive behavior supports, and a Behavior Intervention Plan (BIP).

By the beginning of May, Durham Transportation Services requires a list of all students that will be attending ESY, along with their ARD Transportation Supplement. This supplement lists their address for pick up and drop off, parent and emergency contact information, pertinent student information and any safety equipment the student may require on the bus. The District ESY team works closely with Durham to ensure that these supplements and plans are being followed.

The District ESY team projects the amount and type of materials that will be needed for ESY based upon previous years. During the spring, they then work






on ordering these supplies. Supplies include materials and snacks for students, as well as supplies for staff:

- Office supplies (pens, pencils, crayons, & paper)
- Baggies for edible reinforcers for students
- Plasticware
- Cleaning supplies (such as Clorox wipes, paper towels and trash bags)
- Personal hygiene supplies (such as gloves for staff and diapers for students)

Each teacher that is sending a student to ESY sends materials for their student's goals. Each student is assigned a banker box for the teacher to compile these materials, including folder activities, manipulatives, and student preferred reinforcers and activities. While many students attending ESY have communication devices, not all families choose to take these devices home over the summer. In those situations, the sending teacher adds that device to the student's ESY box so that the staff has this important communication tool readily available for classroom use.

All materials and boxes are brought to Greer Annex building by the last day of school. From there, the district staff work to bring all materials to the ESY campus.

The administration team for ESY consists of an administrator and an assistant administrator. Susan Dobrow is returning as the administrator for ESY again for the summer of 2024; she did a fantastic job during the previous year's ESY.

ESY also relies on the Media Resource Specialist (MRS) to facilitate the use of technology, including classroom SmartBoards and walkie talkies. The walkie talkies are used heavily during ESY to ensure the safety of students and staff throughout the building. These also enable quick and efficient communication between staff members throughout the duration of the ESY day.

There are also various services and supports that may be required by a student to maintain current skills or to ensure student safety:



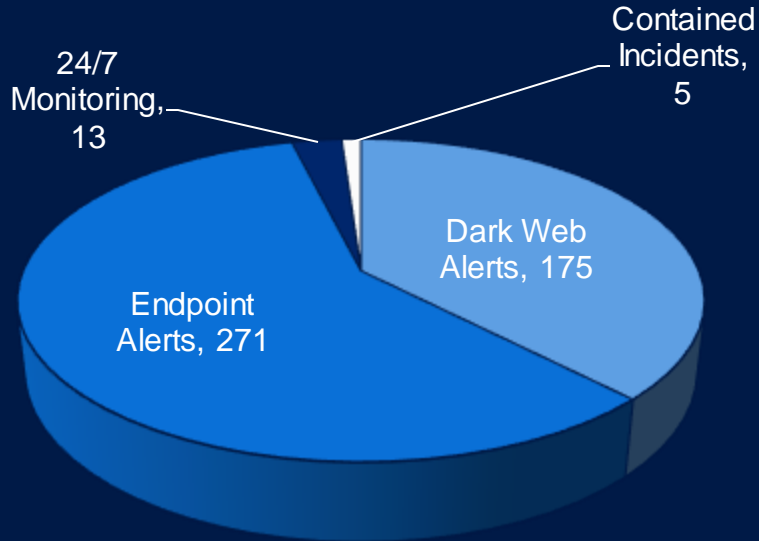
